## HIV PREVENTION FOR KEY POPULATIONS



In Greater Cleveland, effective HIV prevention services including pre- and post-exposure prophylaxis and harm reduction need to be scaled up for key populations such as African Americans, gay men, and young people.

If delivered at sufficient scale, these services would yield a significant reduction in new infections, with a **25% reduction in new infections possible in three years.**



## OUR STRATEGIES



### FUNDING

During 2016–2018, the AFC will raise and allocate at least \$300,000 each year in targeted, responsive, and discretionary grants to community partners.



### CONVENING

During 2016–2018, the AFC will invest in local capacity and an informed and coordinated HIV / AIDS response.



### ADVOCACY

During 2016–2018, the AFC will be an informed advocacy voice for an effective HIV / AIDS response.
